TRAVEL TO NICARAGUA

Project Minnesota/León (PML) is a non-profit, sister-state organization that has two goals:

- 1. to bring together people from Minnesota and León, Nicaragua
- 2. to facilitate community development in León, Nicaragua

To achieve these goals, PML has been facilitating group travel to León for more 30 years.

WHAT CAN GROUPS DO?

- Focus on a specific topic, such as environment, health, education, arts, or human rights.
- Explore a wide array of cultural and natural attractions.
- Sightsee, climb a volcano, hang out at the beach.
- Visit rural communities on the outskirts of León.
- Participate in volunteer opportunities.

Traveling with PML ensures your group will experience Nicaragua in ways a typical tourist visit does not allow.

True Cultural Engagement

Traveling with PML enables your group to

- be immersed more deeply in Nicaraguan culture
- form authentic relationships
- learn about PML's approach to development work in Nicaragua

Bilingual Staff

PML's bilingual staff in León will

- customize your itinerary and help organize the trip
- arrange for a private bus or van to transport your group
- lead the group's daily activities

Homestays

Groups experience authentic Nicaragua by

- staying with host families located in a single neighborhood
- meeting Nicaraguans to understand their culture

Note: Trips can be planned for any time of the year.

IS NICARAGUA SAFE?

Nicaragua is a very safe country and does not experience the violence common in other Central American countries. León, in particular, is a safe, lovely city.

HOW MUCH DOES A TRIP COST?

Depending on the size of the group and length of stay (typically 9 to 14 days), costs average about \$2,000 per person, *including* airfare.

ENVIRONMENTAL/SUSTAINABILITY TRIP TO LEÓN, NICARAGUA

Possible Activities 2017/2018

- Explore León's unique geography and distinctive dry tropical forest.
 - Hike up a volcano.
 - Picnic at a lake in a dormant crater.
 - o Stroll a Pacific Ocean beach.
 - Learn about earthquakes in Nicaragua.
- Boat to the nature reserve on spectacular Juan Venado Island, on the coast of the Pacific Ocean.
 - o Option 1: Camp overnight.
 - Option 2: Watch wildlife and sea turtles hatch (best August through December).



- Roam the paths of the university's tranquil Botanical Garden.
 - See native birds and plants rivaling those of lush Costa Rica.
 - Hear about the university's work to preserve ancient species and increase use of beneficial plants.
- Find out about the history of agriculture in León.
 - Learn about the shift in cash crops—from cotton to peanuts and sugarcane.
 - Compare individual farming with cooperatives and agro-industry.
 - Tour Flor de Caña rum distillery and learn about this mega industry.
- Visit SONATI, an environmental education and conservation program.
 - Learn about climate change, pollution, deforestation, wild-animal trafficking, and trash treatment.
- Analyze the achievements and challenges facing the government's renewable resources agenda.
- View murals portraying the revolutionary history of Nicaragua.



- Connect with locals at San Carlos, a rural community PML works with.
 - Learn about ongoing community initiatives to secure clean drinking water.
 - Find out how El Niño, drought, polluted wells, and large-scale irrigation affect the local water supply.
- · Visit the San Carlos Health Clinic.
 - Learn about local diseases, public health threats, and health care challenges in the community.
- Hike around lovely Los Alpes Ecolodge. Options include:
 - o Milk cows.
 - Eat typical foods.
 - View medicinal plants.
 - Stay overnight.
- Create a traditional sawdust carpet celebrating nature at Xuchialt Art School.
- Tour Twin Engine Coffee site in León (co-owned by a Minnesotan)
 - Learn about their organic, fair trade coffee, which is grown, processed, and packaged in Nicaragua.
